

# MFPC Industry Campaign for PITA 2025

#### Objectives of the campaign

- 1. To create awareness and reach a wider audience to fulfil BNM's regulatory requirement by 31 Dec 2025
- 2. To motivate agents to take the first bold step immediately
- 3. To reduce anxiety; high stakes testing may create significant anxiety; allowing resit can alleviate some of this pressure; enabling agents to perform better when they have a second chance
- 4. To promote equity and access; not all the agents have the same resources and support systems. Some may face personal challenges such as health issues, family responsibilities; lack technical or IT support. Resit helps level the playing field
- 5. To encourage continuous learning; allowing a growth mindset when agents view mistakes as learning opportunities rather than failures
- 6. To improve learning outcomes; improve retention of knowledge, and better preparedness for future courses
- To support diverse learning styles; acknowledge some agents may need additional time to grasp complex concepts, need more time to demonstrate mastery of the subject matter
